ESRD NCC PATIENT GRANT LIBRARY IS NOW AVAILABLE

Do you know a patient who has an idea for providing education or advocacy to other kidney patients? Did you know that an individual can apply for a grant? The new ESRD National Coordinating Center (NCC) Patient Grant Library can help.

The Patient Grant Library is a user-friendly resource for identifying credible funding sources. It highlights a range of opportunities, including:

- Traditional government and private foundation grants
- Crowdfunding resources, such as Plumford and HelpHopeLive
- Unique, talent-based grant sources awarded by the Awesome Foundation

The Patient Grant Library also includes an *Introduction to the Internet* tutorial for individuals who are newer to the online world. The first tutorial, *Internet Basics*, is available on the website. The second, which focuses on Internet privacy and safety, will be available later this month. There is even a section devoted to avoiding fraud and scams. The resources of the Patient Grant Library help users understand how to keep personal information safe online and provide tips on avoiding fraud and scams.

CDC MESSAGE: INCREASE IN PERITONITIS AMONG PATIENTS UNDERGOING PERITONEAL DIALYSIS

Two health departments and CDC are investigating a cluster of peritonitis cases among patients undergoing peritoneal dialysis. Many of the peritonitis events under investigation were caused by *Serratia marcescens* or other gram-negative pathogens.

The CDC Dialysis Safety Team is requesting U.S. clinicians to please report peritonitis cases in peritoneal dialysis patients treated by the same center that meet the following criteria:

- Two or more patients with peritonitis caused by Serratia spp. at the same center since January 1, 2019, or
- An increase in peritonitis caused by gram-negative organisms at the center

NEW CHANGES TO NHSN DIALYSIS COMPONENT

Changes have been made to the NHSN Dialysis Component and are featured below. To <u>view all</u> NHSN changes, please view the entire document under the NHSN Release Schedule/Q2-2019.

Analysis and Reporting:

- 1. Updated dialysis aggregate data from 2016 to 2017 data for dialysis ratetables and run charts.
- 2. Created a new TAP report type and changed report icon for Excess Infections. A new Excess Infections report type allows for modifications to the TAP report without disturbing functionality used by other NHSN components.
- 3. In 2018, the Dialysis Component began collecting data using an Acute Kidney Injury (AKI) location. Now that some data have been collected, we are including data reported to that AKI location in dialysis rate tables and run charts so facilities and groups can review AKI-specific rates for the various dialysis event measures.

NEW MEDICARE CARD NOW AVAILABLE FOR PATIENTS

CMS recently finished mailing new Medicare cards. The new cards without Social Security numbers offer better identity protection. Help protect your patient's personal identity by getting their new Medicare Beneficiary Identifier and using it for Medicare business, including claims submission and eligibility transactions. Give the <u>Get Your New Medicare Card flyer</u> to patients who do not have a new card.

MEDICATION CONVERSION GUIDE NOW AVAILABLE

A Medication Conversion Guide was developed by members of the Medical Review Board for IPRO ESRD Network of New England (Network 1). The Forum's Medical Advisory Council (MAC) finalized and approved the Guide for national use by all dialysis facilities and providers.

The Guide was developed partly in response to concerns expressed by dialysis patients who did not receive their current medications while visiting other dialysis facilities.

This tool is intended to assist physicians to convert the dose of a medication a patient is currently receiving, to a substitute medication that is available, or less costly. Medications converted using this tool must be approved or ordered by the patient's Nephrologist, however, we encourage all care providers and patients to share this guide with their care teams.
