BEST PRACTICE 1

Offer hope, courage and support to patients during their journey toward improved health and wellness.

HOW DO YOU ACHIEVE THIS BEST PRACTICE?

- 1. Empower patients (who have the desire and ability) to become leaders and advocates thru rolemodeling, on-going support, training, and patient advocacy.
- 2. Provide peer-to-peer networking and resources to patients through telephonic, face to face, printed, web-based, and multi-media domains.
- 3. Encourage hope; provide stories of success and education that will assist patients to engage with their caregivers/providers.
- 4. Improve the dialysis environment by using the principles of Culture Change* to make the space especially the waiting room—more welcoming, accessible, comfortable, less stressful, inviting, and cheerful.
- 5. Provide training to the health care team to achieve culture change from a clinical focused model to a patient holistic model that promotes emotional well-being and greater patient involvement.
- 6. Create strategies for the health care team that proactively encourage patients to develop and sustain a positive attitude during their course of treatment.
- 7. Encourage patients spiritual well-being by making staff and patients aware of community resources, including faith based and cultural organizations.
- 8. Encourage patients to see the value of employment, education and volunteer work in their community.
